Antibiotic Stewardship Programs

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services' Conditions of Participation require all U.S. hospitals, including critical access hospitals, to have an active and hospital-wide antibiotic stewardship program as a requirement to receive Medicare and Medicaid payments. In addition, Joint Commission-accredited hospitals must meet the criteria outlined in its antimicrobial stewardship standard.



20 to 50 percent of all antibiotics prescribed in acute care hospitals is unnecessary or inappropriate



More than 2.8 million antibiotic-resistant infections occur in the U.S. each year, with more than 35,000 resulting deaths



The national cost to treat infections caused by six multidrug-resistant germs exceeds \$4.6 billion a year



Dedicated prevention and infection control efforts have reduced deaths from antibiotic-resistant infections by nearly 30% in hospitals
